 - >Address poverty's root causes,
 - Invest in low-income people and communities to be empowered.
 - Support self-sufficiency and self-determination for people to bring permanent & positive change


Principles of Catholic Social Teaching

- Foundational Principle
 for Catholic Social Teaching
- Driving Principle for CCHD Funding

Principles of Catholic Social Teaching



Option for the Poor and Vulnerable

- A basic moral test of society is how it treats its most vulnerable members
- CCHD primarily funds
 initiatives that benefit the poor

Principles of Catholic Social Teaching



Solidarity

- We stand with all people as brothers and sisters in pursuit of justice and peace
- CCHD seeks to change the structures of society that make and keep people poor


Principles of Catholic Social Teaching



Subsidiarity

- Decisions are best made at the level closest to the people affected by them
- CCHD requires that those benefited by an organization's work be part of its governance


Principles of Catholic Social Teaching



Rights and Responsibilities

- All people have basic human rights for themselves and responsibilities to others
- CCHD funds community organizing that empowers individuals to exercise their basic rights

Principles of Catholic Social Teaching




The Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers

- Work brings dignity to the the individual and must be respected and protected
- CCHD supports economic development that promotes the dignity of workers

Principles of Catholic Social Teaching

The Call to Family, Community, and Participation



- The Catholic Church has very clear moral teachings opposing artificial contraception, abortion, same-sex marriage, euthanasia, and capital punishment.
- CCHD funds groups whose work promotes the participation of the community, as well as not contradicting Catholic moral teachings.

Care for God's Creation



- As co-creators with God, human beings must care for and respect all of God's creation at all times.
- CCHD encourages and supports organizations who promote eco-friendly policies and practices.


