1970 Catholic Church's Response To

Address the Root Causes of Poverty in the United States.

Grant money to fund projects which address the root causes of poverty

Organizations must be managed by people experiencing poverty.

Themes: Participation, Self-Help, Empowerment

Mission 1: Allocation of CCHD GRANTS

- Collection in November in EVERY US Catholic Church
- CCHD awards grants to organizations who address a root cause of poverty in THEIR community through institutional change.
- Funding for projects/groups created and maintained by the people impacted by poverty.
- Available Funding “pots”: National CCHD 75% and Local CCHD 25%
- Types of Grants:
 - 1. Community Development Grants**
 - 2. Economic Development Grants**

Mission 2: Social Justice Education

Educate on The Causes Of Poverty

A shift toward promoting social justice education through materials focusing on Catholic Social Teaching. Educating programs seeking to promote a more just society, one in which **all** people are empowered.

Efforts at National CCHD

- Internship Program \$20 per hour (12 hours a week Sept to May)
- Catholic Social Teaching Materials: Lesson plans, Videos, Prayers

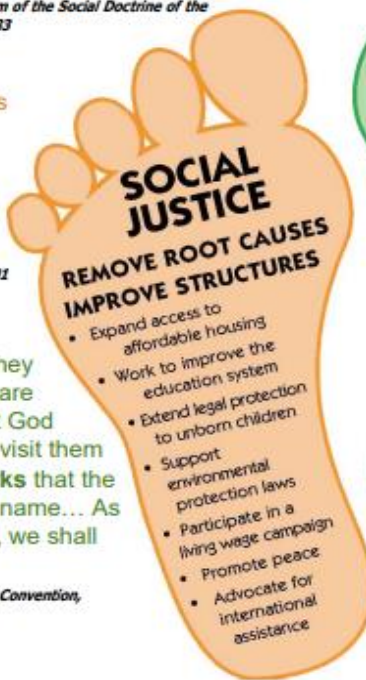

Questions to ask yourself

- Looking at your community, can you identify a root cause of poverty that your group is working on changing?
- Remember to look at treating the cause of the problem not the effects.
- For example, maybe people with low incomes in your area struggle with housing insecurity because a lack of affordable housing in the community.
 - Treating an effect might be establishing a winter shelter to house people in parish buildings for a week.
 - Treating a cause might be working to pass a law mandating that new construction permits require a percentage of the housing built be affordable housing units.

Institutional Change Quiz: true or false

1. Your group opens a free health care clinic. Individuals with low-income can now properly manage conditions such as high blood pressure, diabetes, weight, and smoking cessation.
 2. Your group organizes an email-writing campaign to your city councilperson around the issue of rats that have infested your community. Your group has gotten media coverage and holds a press conference and invites the councilperson who later works on efforts increasing the funding needed for rat abatement.
 3. Your group operates a monthly food donation project where residents who live in food deserts and unable to shop for fresh vegetables and fruit can receive the donated food items.
 4. Your group is concerned about the lack of affordable housing in your community and forms a community land trust to purchase and rehab vacant housing units. These units provide options to help low-income buyers obtain homes. Your model allows community ownership of the land with individual ownership of houses so properties remain affordable.

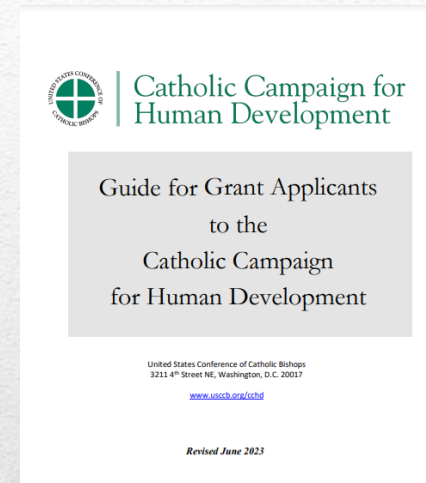
